By order dated 10.12.2003 the adjudicating officer had levied a monetary penalty of

rupees one crore on the appellant for not furnishing the information and documents asked for

in the letter dated June 10, 2002. The grievance of the appellant is that it never received this

letter and, therefore, it could not respond. The original record is available with the officer of

the respondent Board who is present in court. We asked the learned counsel for the

respondent to find out whether letter dated June 10, 2002 was ever served on the appellant

and, if so, when. After examining the record and seeking instructions from the officer, the

learned counsel for the respondent states that there is no material on the record to show that

the said letter was ever served on the appellant. In this view of the matter, the impugned

order cannot be sustained. The appeal is accordingly allowed and the impugned order set

aside. Even though the matter is quite old, we make it clear that it shall be open to the

respondent Board to proceed afresh against the appellant if, it so decides. No costs.
