This appeal is directed against the order dated December 9, 2009 passed by the whole time member of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (for short the Board) confirming the ex parte ad-interim order dated April 23, 2009 in the matter of Pyramid Saimira Theatre Limited. The ex parte order was passed restraining the appellant and others from accessing the capital market pending investigations and that the order has been confirmed by the order now under appeal. We are informed that the investigations have concluded and that the Board is now in the process of analyzing the investigation report.

We have heard the learned counsel for the parties for some time and having regard to the role allegedly played by the appellant as disclosed in the impugned order and also taking note of the fact that the appellant has remained out of the securities market for a considerable period of time, we are inclined to stay the operation of the impugned order by

which the ex parte order has been confirmed against the appellant. We order accordingly.

It is made clear that the order that we have passed shall be without prejudice to the rights

of the respondent Board to proceed further in the matter and shall not be taken as an

expression of our opinion on the merits of the case. The rights and contentions of both the

sides shall remain open. The appeal stands disposed of accordingly. No costs.
